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TeleSCOPE - Preparation for Your Interview

TeleSCOPE - An Introduction

All students in Year 8 at Cardiff High School undertake the TeleSCOPE project.

TeleSCOPE links classroom work with wider learning and reflection. It is an exercise in the building of planning, process and communication skills, confidence and self-esteem that culminates in a 5-minute oral presentation based on your learning achievements.

In this booklet you will find a copy of all your TeleSCOPE tasks. There is one task from each subject area. You should make up a calendar so that you know when each of your tasks is due. Your subject teachers will be working with you on each of the tasks; direct any specific questions regarding the tasks to them.

As the year progresses, you will need to organise a <u>display folder</u> that contains <u>all of the completed tasks</u>. It is important that you keep all completed tasks, no matter what the assessment outcome is. On <u>Wednesday 20th June</u> (Term 2, Week 8) *you will give a 5-minute oral presentation to a member of staff where you will <u>discuss two of the tasks completed to this point</u>. The four tasks scheduled for completion in semester one that MUST be submitted at interview, include <u>PDHPE</u>, <u>Technology</u>, <u>Science</u> and <u>Visual Arts</u>.*

You will also be asked to reflect upon what you have learned and achieved during semester one and will be questioned about your goals for the remainder of the year. A <u>self-assessment and learning contract</u> will form part of this review. Your completed learning contract will be included in your reports for your parents/carers to discuss with you.

Students will receive assistance on how to prepare their oral presentation mid-way through Term 2.

It is important to understand that each of your TeleSCOPE tasks is an integral part of Year 8 coursework and will earn you marks towards your yearly assessment as well as being the basis of your oral presentation. The result of your TeleSCOPE presentation will also be recorded on your school report. You should ensure that you submit all tasks to avoid N award determinations.

Select one Australian designer and answer the following questions:

- 1. Name the Australian designer and their area of design.
- 2. Make a list of this Australian Designer's successful designs and describe one of these in detail.
- 3. Include images; and a hand drawn, coloured sketch of their work. Label and annotate these images
- 4. Outline how the design process has been used by this Designer.
- 5. Describe how the Designer's work has contributed to improve our lifestyle.

Use a computer to present and document your information. Include the hand drawn sketch. Also, include a title page and a bibliography, referencing for the task. Complete PMI.

Students are required to complete a practical investigation during the Stage 4 Science course. The problem students will solve is: **Which material is the best insulator for an ice cube.** The students will perform the investigation independently at home. Students will be provided with a scaffold and further details of the task during week 11 of term 1.

Task Description

Students are to submit the following:

Artmaking: Thematic Cup, Saucer and Placemat (26% of final course mark)

- 1. Design an imaginative themed ceramic cup and saucer with an original paper placemat. Present the following in an A4 display book OR plastic sleeve:
 - At least TWO draft designs/concepts.
 - Present detailed, labelled designs of your final cup & saucer each from at least two viewpoints i.e side on & top view. (10 marks)
- 2. Present your most creative draft idea as a completed artwork set using ceramic processes and techniques that suit your idea/concept.

Your choice of ceramic construction techniques include:

- clay coiling
- clay slab construction
- clay pinch-pot technique
- a <u>combination</u> of any of these methods.

Task Description

- Research a band or performer that fits the period 1960-present.
- Students are to work individually.
- The task is to be presented as a poster (maximum 1 sheet A2) and a five minute class presentation. The date of the presentation will be given in each class.
- The poster must contain the musical analysis of one representative piece as well as biographical and historical information on the subject.

Outcomes Assessed

- 4.7: Demonstrates understanding of the musical concepts through listening, observing, responding, discriminating, analysing, discussing and recording musical ideas.
- 4.8: Demonstrates an understanding of the musical concepts through aural identification and discussion of the features of a range of repertoire.

- At the end of the recording, discuss observations based upon your analysis of the piece.

Mathematics TeleSCOPE 2018: Collecting Data on Car Colour Trends
You will receive a copy of the instructions and Marking Guide for this task in Term 2.

Outcomes Assessed

Students develop understanding and fluency in mathematics through inquiry, exploring and connecting mathematical concepts, choosing and applying problem-solving skills and mathematical techniques, communication and reasoning. In particular, the assessed topics include:

Working Mathematically

- recognises and explains mathematical relationships using reasoning (MA4-3WM)

Data Collection and Representation

Task Description

You have been studying the art of storytelling across time, cultures and perspectives.

During Week 7 Term 3 you will be required to sit an in-class examination where in you construct your own composition (story) under timed conditions.

To prepare for this task students are encouraged to:

- 1. Decided on a genre & context and setting for their chosen work.
- 2. Research the use of language, style, technique and device to engage the audience.
- 3. Prepare and practise writing your ideas down under timed conditions.
- 4. Discuss with your class teacher, your self-edited draft looking for ways to improve.
- 5. Pay careful attention to how your task starts and ends.
- 6. Be precise with grammar, spelling and punctuation.

Exam Question:

You have been asked to write a story for publication in an anthology called 'The Art of Storytelling'. You may write your story in any genre, or context. Your story should be approximately two pages in length and suitable for general publication.

TeleSCOPE - Preparation for Your Interview

General:

Your TeleSCOPE interview will be held on <u>Wednesday 20th June</u> during periods 1-3. You will participate in a 5-minute interview with an allocated teacher where you will discuss and reflect upon what you have learned and achieved so far this year. You are specifically required to present a folder (or similar) <u>containing all the TeleSCOPE</u> <u>assignments you completed in Semester 1</u> and <u>discuss two of these tasks</u>. <u>The discussion will revolve around planning</u>, <u>process and your thoughts about your achievements</u>.

What procedure should you follow?

You should complete all the necessary assignments and submit them for assessment. It is vital that you collect the assignments, once marked, and organise them into the presentation folder for safe keeping and effective organisation.

You need to review the assignments and reflect upon them. Look carefully at what was originally required, what you did, the marks awarded and why. These are all very important aspects of successful learning and you will be questioned about these at interview.

<u>Note:</u> The TeleSCOPE folder must contain <u>ALL</u> your completed TeleSCOPE assignments (PDHPE, Technology, Science, Visual Arts) <u>including teacher feedback</u>, no matter what the outcome was.

On the Day:

- You will be placed in groups of 7-8 students and allocated an interview panel and room
- You will sit quietly in your group while each student delivers their presentation in turn
- The interview will be 5 minutes in duration and the format will be as follows:
 - · Introduce yourself
 - Briefly discuss your interests both in and out of school
 - Present your TeleSCOPE Presentation Folder and briefly look at all tasks
 - Discuss <u>two</u> of the tasks you found most challenging, interesting or rewarding You will need to discuss the selected pieces in some **detail**.
- At the end of the interview you will return to normal classes for the remainder of the day.
